WHAT ARE THE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS?

- NSW HSC or equivalent OR Tertiary Preparation Certificate OR completion of a Certificate IV qualification or higher.
- Pre-admission interview.
- If you do not meet the entry requirements, you can apply under special admission provisions, including mature age and disadvantage. You will be required to submit documentation to support your application for special admission.
- International students require an IELTS score of 6.5 to enter the Bachelor or 5.5 to enter the Diploma.

This three-year professional degree is made for people who want to work in the financial services sector. It has been developed with industry input to allow students to complete a major in either accounting or financial planning.

Both majors cover subjects in management, marketing, law, economics and business statistics to give you the full range of skills and knowledge you need to become a professional.

Both majors also include an industry placement in Year 3 which provides valuable real-world experience and a great chance to build important industry contacts. You can even graduate with a double major by completing additional subjects.

After the course is successfully completed, you will be qualified to work in a wide range of financial services roles and **be eligible to apply for membership to CPA, CA ANZ and FPA.**

The Bachelor of Applied Commerce is a FASEA approved degree.

The Financial Planning major meets the Financial Planning Education Council (FPEC) requirements and is ASIC RG146 compliant.

HOW DO I COMPLETE THE COURSE?

The Bachelor of Applied Commerce requires you to complete 24 subjects and a total of 240 credit points.

Also available:

- the one-year Diploma of Applied Commerce requires the completion of 8 subjects and 80 credit points.

All applications for exemption must be made to the course coordinator and include supporting documents. You should attend classes until you are formally advised that your application for exemption has been granted.

CAN I ENROL IF I AM AN INTERNATIONAL STUDENT?

International students can enrol in most TAFE NSW degree courses, subject to meeting course entry requirements and satisfying student visa conditions.

Are you interested in numbers? Do you want to work in the financial services sector? Then the Diploma of Applied Commerce is for you.

The Diploma of Applied Commerce is a one year full-time (or part-time equivalent) course providing an introduction to the finance industry. The course has been developed in consultation with accounting and financial planning industry input, so you'll develop all the knowledge you need for a job you'll love.

Subjects focus on accounting and financial planning fundamentals, marketing and management, economics, statistics and finance and investment. An academic foundations subject is also included to support you in your learning and to help you develop academic writing and study skills.

On completion of the Diploma of Applied Commerce, you can choose to either enter the workforce in entry level finance roles, or continue your studies in the Bachelor of Applied Commerce majoring in accounting or financial planning. You will get one full year of credit if you continue your studies in the Bachelor.

HOW DO I COMPLETE THE COURSE?

The Diploma of Applied Commerce requires the completion of eight subjects. The subjects are:

- Academic Foundations
- Business Maths and Statistics
- Management Fundamentals
- Marketing Fundamentals
- Foundations of Accounting
- Financial Planning Fundamentals
- Finance and Investment
- Applied Economics



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WHAT ARE THE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS?

Domestic applicants must have completed:

- NSW HSC or equivalent, OR
- Tertiary Preparation Certificate, OR
- a Certificate IV qualification or higher.

If you do not meet the entry requirements, you can apply under special admission provisions, which include mature age and disadvantaged. You will be required to submit documentation to support your application for special admission.

International applicants must have an overall IELTS level of 5.5 with no band less than 5.0. The IELTS test must have been completed in the last two years.

All applicants will be invited to a pre-admission interview prior to being offered a place in the course.
