WHAT ARE THE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS?

- NSW HSC or equivalent. HSC level English with a Band 4 result (or higher) OR a Tertiary Preparation Certificate OR completion of a Certificate IV qualification (or higher).
- If you do not have a Band 4 in English you may need to complete an International English Language Testing System (IELTS) test at your own expense. You'll need to achieve a Band 4 or higher to be eligible for entry to this degree.
- If you do not meet the entry requirements, you can apply under special admission provisions, including mature age and disadvantage. You will be required to submit documentation to support your application for special admission.

TUITION FEES

Domestic students:

\$1,150 per 10 credit point subject
\$36,800 indicative full Bachelor course fee.

International students:

\$1,670 per 10 credit point subject
\$53,440 indicative full Bachelor course fee.

The Bachelor of Early Childhood Education and Care (Birth-5) will get you prepared to be an early childhood teacher who can mix theoretical knowledge with practical skills in the workplace.

You will study child development, welfare, ethics, diversity and social justice. These practical units are supported by work experience placements which allow you to use your skills in a real-life environment.

There is a strong, applied learning focus to this industry-recognised degree so, when you graduate, you will be ready to work in a variety of settings including long day care, preschool, child and family services and early intervention services.

HOW DO I COMPLETE THE COURSE?

The Bachelor of Early Childhood Education and Care (Birth-5) requires you to complete 40 subjects and a total of 320 credit points.

The course includes a total of eight work-placement subjects - one each semester. The work placement subjects do not attract tuition fees or credit points, but must be passed in order to complete the degree.

You should attend classes until you are formally advised that your application for exemption has been granted.

CAN I ENROL IF I AM AN INTERNATIONAL STUDENT?

International students can enrol in most TAFE NSW degree courses, subject to meeting course entry requirements and satisfying student visa conditions.
