AGSKILLED

AgSkilled is a NSW Government initiative, with industry partners Cotton Australia and the GRDC, to provide the Cotton and Grains industries with vocational training to drive the profitability and productivity of both industries.

To be eligible for AgSkilled subsidised training you must be working in or seeking employment in the NSW cotton or grains industry. You must also meet the Smart and Skilled eligibility requirements.

COURSE OVERVIEW

This course is for trainees and other people who want to acquire the skills needed for safe work practices as a ginner in the cotton ginning industry. You will learn about production processes and production support, ginning machinery, ginning presses, using specialist tools and machinery and competitive manufacturing processes.

You will be able to perform specialised technical tasks and multi-disciplinary roles within a cotton ginning environment. This qualification is typically used to develop skill and knowledge in the application of specialised technical, operational and supervisory skills within cotton ginning enterprises.

Learners will be able to pursue a career in Cotton Ginning leading to co-ordination and supervisory responsibilities.
