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What do you need to become a teacher at TAFE NSW?

- a nationally recognised qualification in the discipline in which you want to teach
- between three and five years of industry experience (depending upon the industry)
- a relevant education qualification (such as TAE40116 Certificate IV in Training and Assessment)

Don't have a TAE40116 Certificate IV in Training and Assessment?

Then register your interested to become a teacher. You could be selected for a fully funded TAE40116 Certificate IV in Training and Assessment qualification as part of the Teacher Scholarship Program. If you already hold this certificate, you are not eligible for a scholarship in this program. You are encouraged to gain the upgrade units and then apply for Teaching positions advertised.

What is the Teacher Scholarship Program?

The Teacher Scholarship Program provides fully funded TAFE NSW delivery of the TAE40116 Certificate IV in Training and Assessment to create teacher pipelines in hard-to-fill workforce shortage areas and to meet the goals outlined in the TAFE NSW Aboriginal Employment Strategy.

How is the Certificate IV in Training and Assessment (TAE40116) delivered?

Successful Teacher Scholarship candidates will complete their studies via connected classrooms, which is a blend of online and face to face delivery. Online learning will be conducted via teams, where face to face learning can occur at a campus near you. There will also be a requirement to travel away from base, which is around 3 days per semester. This delivery program will also utilise Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander learning pedagogies and will offer supportive services if required.

How long do Teacher Scholarship candidates have to complete their studies?

This course will take up to 18 months to complete.

How are Teacher Scholarship candidates supported?

Each Teacher Scholarship candidate will have a mentor allocated to them. Mentors will maintain regular contact throughout the scholar's studies, providing advice to help resolve issues, as well as supporting the transition into a teaching role.

There is also the TAE40116 Certificate IV in Training and Assessment delivery team, providing support and advice in relation to learning and assessment tasks. This includes access to tutors and Aboriginal Support Officers.

The Teacher Scholarship Program is a collaboration between the Aboriginal Employment Advisory Team and the Talent Strategy Team, who will also provide ongoing support to all candidates - including inviting candidates into the TAFE NSW Aboriginal Employees network.
