Course entry requirements

TAFE NSW International student applicant qualifications are assessed as part of the admissions process. For academic equivalences by country, see tafensw.edu.au/international

As a general guide, for diplomas and bachelor degrees, Year 12 or equivalent is required. Please also note:

- Additional requirements apply for most higher education courses.
- To enter a diploma or advanced diploma course, you may need to complete a Certificate III or Certificate IV course, or demonstrate an equivalent skill level. If a prerequisite applies, you will receive an offer letter which includes both the lower and higher level course.
- For design, digital media, fashion technology, fine arts and music courses, you are required to submit a portfolio, design, written task or audio files along with your application.

How to apply and enrol

1. Choose a course and location

Find a course at tafensw.edu.au/international
On the course web page ensure that you meet
the entry requirements for that course and pick

2. Prepare certified copies of your documents

A certified copy is a copy of the original document signed and dated by the organisation that issued the original document, a government official, Public Notary or Justice of the Peace, or an education agent of TAFE NSW, confirming that they have sighted the original.

3. How to apply

5. Receive offer letter

A TAFE NSW Admissions Support Officer will assess your application and issue your offer letter(s) with an invoice.

6. Make payment

Accept your offer and make payment.

7. Get a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE)
Your Admissions Support Officer will issue a
Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE).

8. Apply for visa

Apply for your visa and enrol at TAFE NSW.
