The TAFE NSW Gili Awards is a significant recognition and celebratory event for Aboriginal students, parents, Aboriginal communities, industry and TAFE NSW.

The purpose of the Awards is to celebrate and recognise the achievements of Aboriginal TAFE NSW students, staff and programs that have contributed to their communities through training and education.

Awards Nomination and Information Package

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Student awards

Encouragement award – This award is presented to Aboriginal students who have completed a TAFE NSW course at Certificate I or II in 2015.

- Aboriginality
- Course completed and certificate level (50 words)
- How has the student demonstrated (in 800 words):
 - o excellence in attendance and participation,
 - o achievement of academic potential,
 - o consistency of effort, and
 - o a positive attitude to further education and/or employment?
 - Teacher reference/validation (500 words)

Achievement award – This award is presented to Aboriginal students who have successfully completed a TAFE NSW course at Certificate III or IV in 2015.

- Aboriginality
- Course completed and certificate level (50 words)
- How has the student demonstrated (in 800 words):
 - o excellence in attendance and participation,
 - o achievement of academic potential,
 - o consistency of effort, and
 - o a positive attitude to further education and/or employment?
 - Teacher reference/validation (500 words)

Award for academic excellence – This award is presented to Aboriginal students who have successfully completed a TAFE NSW Course at Certificate IV or above in 2015.

- Aboriginality
- Course completed and certificate level (50 words)
- How has the student demonstrated (in 800 words):
 - o excellence in attendance and participation,
 - o excellence in achievement of academic results and outcomes,
 - o consistency in quality of work, and
 - o a positive attitude to further education or employment?
 - Teacher reference/validation (500 words)

Apprentice & Trainee of The Year Awards – These awards are presented to an Aboriginal Apprentice and Trainee who have shown excellence and commitment in their chosen field.

- Aboriginality
- Apprenticeship or Traineeship completed in 2015 (50 words)
- Teacher reference/validation (in 700 words):
 - o Demonstrated excellence in educational achievement, and
 - o Positive attitude to further education.
- Employer reference/validation (in 700 words):
 - o Demonstrated excellence in practical work, and
 - o Positive attitude towards employment.

TVET Award (schools) – This award is presented to Aboriginal students who have demonstrated excellence in achievement in a TAFE Delivered Vocational Education and Training (TVET) course during high school.

- Aboriginality
- Details of qualification completed in 2015 (100 words):
 - O What was the course and certificate level?
 - O What school did the nominee attend?
- How has the student demonstrated (in 800 words):
 - o excellence in attendance and participation,
 - o achievement of academic potential,
 - o consistency of effort, and
 - o a positive attitude to further education or employment?
- Teacher reference/validation (500 words)

Staff Awards

Aboriginal Staff Award – This award is presented to an Aboriginal TAFE NSW Institute or State Office employee who has made significant contribution to the vocational education and training outcomes of Aboriginal students.

- Aboriginality
- How has the staff member contributed to improved vocational education and training outcomes for Aboriginal people? (650 words)
- How has the staff member shown a commitment to working in partnership with Aboriginal communities? (650 words)
- How has the staff member been a positive role model to all TAFE NSW staff and stakeholders? (650 words)

Non-Aboriginal Staff Award – This award is presented to a non-Aboriginal TAFE NSW Institute or State Office employee who has made significant contribution to the vocational education and training outcomes of Aboriginal students.

- How has the staff member contributed to improved vocational education and training outcomes for Aboriginal people? (650 words)
- How has the staff member shown a commitment to working in partnership with Aboriginal communities? (650 words)
- How has the staff member been a positive role model to all TAFE NSW staff and stakeholders? (650 words)

Bruce Kendall Award for Recognition of Service to TAFE NSW – This category recognises excellence and long-term commitment of TAFE NSW Institute or State Office Aboriginal employees to Aboriginal education and training.

- Aboriginality
- Minimum of 10 years' service in TAFE NSW or State Office (50 words)
- Outline the staff member's significant long-term contribution and dedication to Aboriginal education and training in TAFE NSW or State Office (1000 words)
- How is/was the nominee a role model and advocate for Aboriginal education and training, projecting a positive image to all TAFE NSW staff and stakeholders? (1000 words)

Institute awards

Industry Partnership Award – This award is presented to a TAFE NSW Institute that has partnered with industry to develop a program for Aboriginal people that has contributed to the capacity building and employment outcomes for Aboriginal communities in NSW.

- Who were the partners? How many people were involved? (100 words)
- How was the Aboriginal community involved? (200 words)
- What program/s have been implemented through the partnership? (200 words)
- What were/are the goals of the partnership and have they been achieved? (350 words)
- What were the challenges faced in achieving the goals? (350 words)
- What were the outcomes in terms of course completions and employment? (350 words)
- How did the partnership contribute to the social, economic and cultural development of the community? (350 words)

Community Engagement Award – This award is presented to a TAFE NSW Institute that demonstrates exceptional community engagement in the development and implementation of programs to achieve outcomes identified in partnership with the community.

- How did the Institute engage the Aboriginal community and why? (200 words)
- Which community was the focus, identify the stakeholders? (100 words)
- What program/s, initiative/s, and/or strategies have been implemented? (200 words)
- What were the desired outcomes and have they been achieved? (350 words)
- What were the challenges faced in achieving the outcomes? (350 words)
- Outline the training and employment pathways that have been generated for community members (200 words)

Youth Engagement Award – This award is presented to a TAFE NSW Institute that has developed and effectively implemented strategies to enhance youth engagement in consultation with local stakeholders.

- What program/s, initiative/s and/or strategies were implemented to enhance youth engagement? (200 words)
- Who was involved and what were their roles? (100 words)
- What were the desired outcomes and have they been achieved? (350 words)
- Describe the impact on participation and delivery of services? (350 words)
- How did this build the capacity of Institute staff to work effectively with youth?
 (400 words)
- What positive impacts has this had on the wider community? (150 words)

Award for Institute Innovation – This award is presented to a TAFE NSW Institute demonstrating innovation in Aboriginal Vocational Education and Training through NEW business models achieving outstanding outcomes for Aboriginal learners and communities.

- Describe the Institute's innovative new business model (500 words)
- How does this model contribute to outstanding outcomes in Aboriginal Education and Training (1000 words)

Nomination Guidelines

Aboriginality: for awards where Aboriginality is in the selection criteria, the following definition of Aboriginality applies:

The nominee must be of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander descent, the nominee must identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander and the nominee must be accepted as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander in the community in which they reside.

- Aboriginal TAFE Students in TAFE colleges, distance education, correctional centres, juvenile justice centres as well as NSW Government schools and independent schools are eligible to be nominated.
- The 2016 TAFE NSW Gili Awards are presented for achievements in the 2015 calendar year.
- Nominees must fulfil all selection criteria related to the relevant category to be eligible for an award.
- Nominators must provide written support for their nominee against the award selection criteria, stating the reason/s why they have nominated the person/Institute/community or Industry program. If written support is not submitted the nomination will be considered void. Written support must be within the word limit for each criterion.
- Nominations must include all nominator's details on the Nomination Details Form (Appendix A).
- If nominating in multiple categories for one nominee, a separate submission must be completed for each nomination.
- Other attachments with a maximum of 2 x A4 pages can be included to support the nomination (excluding transcripts).
- Nomination documentation must be legible.
- Nominations must be sent to the Institute Aboriginal Education and Training Unit by the deadline otherwise nominations will not be accepted.

- Institute staff must check nominees transcripts (if applicable) prior to Institute
 Director endorsement.
- The best nomination in each category in each Institute (as endorsed by the Institute Director) will be forwarded to the State Office Aboriginal Education Unit.
- Institutes can only submit one nomination per Gili Award category to the State Office Aboriginal Education Unit.
- Institutes must submit nominations using the Nomination Details Form (appendix A) and the Institute Shortlist Endorsement (appendix B).

Submission of Nominations

Nomination submissions can be emailed, posted or faxed to the Institute's Manager of Aboriginal Education and Training (Appendix C) in your Institute.

Nomination process for State Office Staff

Nominations for State Office staff must be endorsed by the nominee's Manager/Director to be deemed eligible. Nominations can be sent directly to the State Office Aboriginal Education Unit.

Please Note:

Nominations (except for State Office Staff) sent directly to the State Office Aboriginal Education Unit without endorsement by the Institute's Manager of Aboriginal Education and Training, and Institute Director will not be accepted and will be considered void.
