STUDY COMMITMENT

This is a part time day, face to face course. You will need to attend approximately 5 hours of class, over 1 days a week, for 40 weeks. As well as the in-class component, you will need to complete approximately 6 hours of other study per week.

You may also be required to complete approximately 3.8 hours of additional study each week outside of class hours, including review and revision of classwork.

IS THIS COURSE RIGHT FOR YOU?

This course offering is designed for people who: This is a beginner course for learners who have just started learning English and who may have had minimal exposure to the language. It provides English language learning for EAL learners, primarily targeting newly arrived migrants and refugees who need to develop language skills to participate in a limited range of contexts. Other groups who benefit from this course include international students, long-term migrants and Aboriginal students. The certificate includes elective numeracy modules for those EAL learners who may also need to develop numeracy skills. This course is intended to provide participants with the following general education outcomes: learning skills to enter formal learning environments English language proficiency at the equivalence of International Second Language Proficiency Ratings (ISLPR) 1+, International English Language Testing

System (IELTS) 4 or Common European Framework (CEFR) A2+ English language proficiency to meet some performance features of Australian Core Skills Framework (ACSF) 1 indicators

SMART AND SKILLED FEES
