INDUSTRY DEMAND

Demand for animal care workers is booming with growth driven by consumer expectations on how their furry companion should be cared for. These greater expectations is leading to employers to need workers who are qualified and experienced. The animal care field is broad and highly competitive. The course equips you with diverse range of skills to put you ahead of the pack in a skills shortage climate. It is also the official pre-requisite for the Certificate IV in Veterinary Nursing.

Entry Requirements

When you study with TAFE NSW, we want you to succeed. Entry requirements allow us to make sure that you have the right pre-existing knowledge and skills to achieve your chosen qualification. You will need to provide evidence that you meet the requirements listed in this section.

TRAINING PACKAGE REQUIREMENTS

There are no Training Package entry requirements for this qualification.

TAFE NSW REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for this course, you must:

- Have access to an animal care facility where you can gain hands-on skills
- In some areas across NSW this course is in high demand. Depending on your campus location, you may need to go through an application process to secure your position.

LICENSING REQUIREMENTS

No licensing, legislative or certification requirements apply to this qualification.

WORK PLACEMENT

At TAFE NSW we provide training that includes hands-on, practical experience. Work placement ensures you have the job ready skills to achieve competency in this course.

Depending on your location, you must secure a minimum of one day or 8 hours of work placement per week with a suitable industry employer, before enrolling this course.

Work placement can involve paid or volunteer arrangements. We recommend you chose a work placement that aligns with your career goals. For example, a veterinary clinic if you would like to be a veterinary nurse, or a wildlife park if you would like to be a ranger.

The animal industry is highly competitive, so to ensure you secure placement we suggest you visit the facilities you are interested in and introduce yourself with your resume in hand. TAFE NSW will cover your workplace insurance while you are actively enrolled and on placement. Detailed information regarding

this is provided to you upon enrolment.

BE PREPARED

To be prepared for this course, it is recommended that you have:

- A passion for animals and their welfare
- A reasonable fitness level to handle animals and carry out manual lifting

To successfully complete this course, you will need:

It is advantageous, but not compulsory that whilst undertaking this qualification the learner should seek to gain a period of work placement or work experience in an animal care environment and/or workplace. Flexible delivery students must organise at least 1 day of work placement in an animal care business within the animal care industry. Businesses may include, pet stores, pounds, RSPCA or for vet nurse students ? veterinary clinics. Flexible delivery classes also have access to the simulated workplaces (campus animal houses) on TAFE premises. The simulated environment is accessed at residential schools when practical activities are taught and assessed. Demonstration of skills and performance evidence requirements in a simulated environment on TAFE premises, will reflect current industry standards and activities.

INFORMATION SESSIONS

STUDY COMMITMENT

This is a Part Time Day Class course. You will need to attend approximately 5.7 hours of class, over 1 day a week, for 38 weeks. You may also be required to complete approximately 9.5 hours of additional study each week outside of class hours, including Private Study, research, assignment preparation and work experience.

The Certificate II in Animal Studies is an introductory course into the animal care industry. This covers basic animal care including subject areas on; identification, handling, feeding, WHS and workplace communications. There are many potential job roles at this level in the animal care industry for those willing and able to do the physical side of the work e.g.:- Animal shelter attendant, Kennel hand, Cattery attendant, Pet shop attendant.

The Certificate II Animal Studies also offers a pathway for further learning such as; ACM30117 Certificate III in Animal Studies, ACM30417 Certificate III in Companion Animal Services, ACM30617 Certificate III in Pet Grooming and ACM40412 Certificate IV in Veterinary Nursing.

There are no entry requirements for this qualification however, local entry requirements do exist for this course which include; it is highly recommended that whilst undertaking this qualification the learner should seek to gain a period of work placement or work experience in an animal care environment and/or workplace. Students enrolled in the blended delivery option are required to source one working day per week in a suitable animal care workplace.

IS THIS COURSE RIGHT FOR YOU?

This course offering is designed for people who are entry-level students, some may have a disability. Disability consultants will be contacted if student indicates they may need assistance during the course. Communication is undertaken with disability consultant, section and student to determine this. During this communication aspects such as reasonable adjustment will be discussed for both delivery and assessment. Students in this group are wishing to enter the Animal Care industry. Some students are studying this as a pre-requisite to ACM40412/ ACM40418 Certificate IV Veterinary Nursing.

SERVICES AND STUDY SUPPORT

There are additional learning and study tools available for this course, including -

- Support is based on discussion with students and enrolment details.

- A one-on-one interview can be undertaken and if deemed applicable, a meeting will be arranged to discuss the LLN assistance that TAFE NSW can provide to the learner, with a view to creating an individual training and learning plan that best addresses the learner's LLN needs.
