Course Description

This qualification reflects the role of workers who develop and facilitate programs for young people through a range of community-based programs designed to address the social, behavioural, health, welfare, developmental and protection needs of young people.

This work may be undertaken through employment in community, government and youth sector agencies and workers will be:

- responsible for implementing policies and guidelines of the employing organisation
- largely self-directed with fairly autonomous decision-making capacity under the indirect supervision of a manager.

No licensing, legislative or certification requirements apply to this qualification at the time of publication.

ENROLLING IN FIRST AID UNITS OF COMPETENCY

If you are seeking to enrol in a First Aid unit of competency you are advised that to complete the unit you must be able to perform basic life support skills, for example control bleeding and perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR). If you have a disability that would prevent you from performing required basic life support skills you are advised that you will not be able to achieve the unit of competency.

Entry Requirements

When you study with TAFE NSW, we want you to succeed. Entry requirements allow us to make sure that you have the right pre-existing knowledge and skills to achieve your chosen qualification. You will need to provide evidence that you meet the requirements listed in this section.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

TAFE NSW offers the Certificate IV in Youth Work as either a traineeship or non-traineeship, so you can create the career you want.

Non-traineeship

There are no entry requirements for non-trainees. You can enrol in this course now.

Traineeship

To be eligible for this course you must:

- Be employed in the community services industry as this course is delivered in the workplace
- Have a signed traineeship contract

COURSE SUCCESS REQUIREMENTS

During your study, you will need to meet specific requirements that are necessary for you to complete your course work and be successful.

You will need to meet the following success requirements to be able to undertake work placement within industry. Your teacher will let you know when you need to provide evidence of:

- Criminal Record Check
- Occupational assessment, screening and vaccination against infectious diseases
- Health care worker/student vaccination record card
- Working with Children Check (WWCC)
- Signed code of conduct form and any other forms
- Any additional evidence your work placement provider requires

WORK EXPERIENCE

Work experience provides you with exposure to situations and circumstances that cannot be replicated in a learning environment.

Work experience is not mandatory for this qualification; however, this is a highly practical course with your course work structured to include 120 hours of work experience.

TAFE Digital students: You are responsible for arranging your own work experience. Our SkillsTeam can offer support and guidance to assist you.

Campus-based students: TAFE NSW will arrange your work experience with a suitable industry employer.

Decisions on where you will be placed are guided through a nomination process of your preferred location and your personal circumstances.

If you have already secured paid or voluntary work with a community agency the SkillsTeam will assess

its suitability for your work experience.

Work experience generally only begins once you have had significant contact with your teacher and they are satisfied that you are ready to benefit from on-the-job industry learning.

IS THIS COURSE RIGHT FOR YOU?

To be prepared for this course, it is recommended that you:

- Are empathetic, patient and able to empower others
- Are personable and able to build rapport with young people

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

With 130 locations across the state, TAFE NSW tailors qualifications to meet the needs of the local community and specific student groups (like apprentices, fast-tracked and online students). To make sure this course is the right fit for you, we will need you to demonstrate that you can meet the additional requirements below.

To be enrolled in this course, you need to be able to provide evidence that you are able to demonstrate a minimum level of literacy to enter and complete the course. This screening will take place at the information sessions. If the learner does not achieve the required entry level, enrolment into CHC32015 Certificate III in Community Services will be accepted. Students must have a Working with Children Check (WWCC) to enable them to go out on their work placement. They must also be prepared to undergo a Criminal Record Check if required to by the host agency. If their placement is in a NSW Health facility, they must be prepared to show evidence of immunisation and go through the relevant NSW Health procedures surrounding this.

To successfully complete this course, you will need to complete 18 Units of Competency in the Certificate IV in Youth Work and do a total Work Placement of 120 hours. This can be in their own workplace if the type of employment is assessed as sufficient for the Certificate IV level. Otherwise a suitable placement is negotiated by TAFE NSW negotiating with potential host agencies on the students behalf.
