Course Description

This qualification reflects the role of workers in a range of community settings and clients homes, who provide training and support in a manner that empowers people with disabilities to achieve greater levels of independence, self-reliance, community participation and wellbeing. Workers promote a person-centred approach, work without direct supervision and may be required to supervise and/or coordinate a small team.

To achieve this qualification, the candidate must have completed at least 120 hours of work as detailed in the Assessment Requirements of the units of competency.

No licensing, legislative, regulatory or certification requirements apply to this qualification at the time of publication.

ENROLLING IN FIRST AID UNITS OF COMPETENCY

If you are seeking to enrol in a First Aid unit of competency you are advised that to complete the unit you must be able to perform basic life support skills, for example control bleeding and perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR). If you have a disability that would prevent you from performing required basic life support skills you are advised that you will not be able to achieve the unit of competency.

WORK PLACEMENTS

Information Sessions and more about the course

Orientation session is on Monday 22 July 2019 at 3.30pm via Skype. You will be contacted in regards to how to access the Skype session.

120 hours of work placement is required.

Skype can be accessed from any online device such as a mobile phone, tablet or computer. You do not have to attend a TAFE Campus however you can use the facilities and services such as computers and WIFI at any TAFE NSW Campus if you need to. This course will run for one year. After you enrol you will be contacted by the Course Co-ordinator who will help you to use Skype and some of the other technology involved with this course.

ENROLLING IN FIRST AID UNITS OF COMPETENCY

During the practical CPR assessment you will be required to perform at least 2 minutes of uninterrupted CPR both on an infant and adult mannequin placed on the floor. This is the training package requirement and you should consider your ability to perform this assessment task before enrolling.

Attendance

Mondays from 3.30pm to 7.30pm and Tuesday afternoons from 3.30pm to 5.30pm via Skype sessions.

Fee Details

Depending on your previous qualifications and experience your fee may decrease from the maximum shown.

Payment by instalment may also be available. Your fee and eligibility for concession/exemption will be

calculated and confirmed during the enrolment process.

This training is subsidised by the NSW Government, and as a result your fee is determined through Training Services NSW formal eligibility criteria. This criteria will determine your exact fee. Students who meet additional specified criteria, may be eligible for a concession fee or a fee exemption. In claiming the concession or exemption students will be required to supply the required evidence to support the claim in accord with the requirements of Smart and Skilled eligibility.

Payment Plans are available through TAFE NSW for Smart and Skilled eligible qualifications.

To activate your eligibility you must pay the student fee component PRIOR to commencement of the learning activity.

Enrolments will open from 14 October 2019 for our February 2020 intake.
