Course Description

This qualification reflects the role of workers participating in the design, implementation and evaluation of leisure, health activities and programs for clients in one or more sector areas. Workers may be in residential facilities and/or in community agencies and day centres, completing specialised tasks and functions in relation to leisure and health. While workers are responsible for their own outputs, work is carried out under direct or indirect supervision within defined organisation guidelines.

To achieve this qualification, the candidate must have completed at least 120 hours of work as detailed in the Assessment Requirements of the units of competency.

No licensing, legislative, regulatory or certification requirements apply to this qualification at the time of publication.

ENROLLING IN FIRST AID UNITS OF COMPETENCY

If you are seeking to enrol in a First Aid unit of competency you are advised that to complete the unit you must be able to perform basic life support skills, for example control bleeding and perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR). If you have a disability that would prevent you from performing required basic life support skills you are advised that you will not be able to achieve the unit of competency.

- Are interested in gaining employment as a Recreational Activities Officer in a Health or community services setting.
- Have a National Criminal Record Check without convictions.
- Have the physical ability to complete tasks required of a Recreational Activities Officer.
- A basic level of literacy, English language skills and entry level employability and life skills which will enable you to provide support to clients.
- You will also require basic computer skills to complete course work and assessments which will be accessed through an online learning platform.
