Entry Requirements

When you study with TAFE NSW, we want you to succeed. Entry requirements allow us to make sure that you have the right pre-existing knowledge and skills to achieve your chosen qualification. You will need to provide evidence that you meet the requirements listed in this section.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

TAFE NSW offers the Diploma of Community Services as either a traineeship or non-traineeship, so you can create the career you want.

Non-traineeship

There are no entry requirements for non-trainees.

Traineeship

To be eligible to undertake this course as a traineeship you must:

- Be employed in the community services industry, as evidenced by a letter of offer from your employer, as this course is delivered in the workplace
- Have a signed traineeship contract

COURSE SUCCESS REQUIREMENTS

During your study, you will need to meet specific requirements that are necessary for you to complete your course work and be successful.

You will need to meet the following success requirements to be able to undertake work placement within industry (see work placement information).

Your teacher will let you know when you need to provide evidence of your valid and current:

- Working with Children Check (WWCC)
- Criminal History Check

IS THIS COURSE RIGHT FOR YOU?

WORK PLACEMENT

In this course you will be required to undertake a mandated 100 hours of work placement.

Work placement provides you with opportunities to refine your practical skills and gain on-the-job experience.

You may need to comply with some (or all) of the following requirements.

1. NSW Health

Before you start any clinical placement in a NSW Health facility, you will be required to:

- Meet NSW Health's criminal record check requirements
- Sign the NSW Health Code of Conduct form and any other forms required by NSW Health
- Undertake occupational assessment, screening and vaccination against infectious diseases, and provide your Health care worker/Student vaccination record card

2. Aged care work

Before you undertake any clinical placements in an aged care facility, you must [complete a Federal criminal record check](#)

3. Community and children's services

Anyone in child-related work (including student placements and volunteers) must have a current Working with Children Check in line with the Office of Children's Guardian phase-in schedule and processes.

- When there has been reasonable amount of student/teacher contact and they are satisfied you are ready to benefit from workplace learning and perform workplace duties and,

- When your teacher is satisfied you are ready to benefit from workplace learning and perform workplace duties

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

With 130 locations across the state, TAFE NSW tailors qualifications to meet the needs of the local community and specific student groups (like apprentices, fast-tracked and online students). To make sure this course is the right fit for you, we will need you to demonstrate that you can meet the additional requirements below.

To be enrolled in this course, you need to be able to provide evidence that you have:

- The Diploma of Community Services is aimed at the level of a team leader within a community services organisation. There is an assumption of having the underpinning knowledge and skills needed for working with clients.

To successfully complete this course, you will need:

- to have current experience in the community services sector, this can include face to face contact with clients, case management and intake in the areas of alcohol and other drugs, mental health, domestic, and family violence, child protection, disability or aged care. Alternatively you may have successfully completed Certificate IV in the following areas community services ageing, disability, youth work, mental health.
- There is 100 hours of workplacement for this qualification.

STUDY COMMITMENT

This is a part-time day blended course. You will need to attend approximately 8 hours of class, over 2 days a week, for 2 years. As well as the in-class component, you will need to complete approximately 5 hours of other study per week.

You may also be required to complete approximately 9 hours of additional study each week outside of class hours, including online research, moodle, studespace (independent study, research, practice and assignments).

Fee Details

SMART AND SKILLED FEES

This course is government-subsidised, meaning you pay a portion of the full course fee to TAFE NSW and the NSW Government will pay the balance. However, you must meet certain eligibility criteria for this to apply.

Depending on your previous qualifications and experience, your fee may be less than the maximum fee quoted. Your actual fee and eligibility for concession/exemption will be calculated and confirmed during the enrolment process.

PAYMENT OPTIONS AND ASSISTANCE

This course is approved for a Commonwealth VET Student Loan (VSL). If you meet the VSL eligibility and academic suitability requirements, you are able to apply to the Commonwealth for a loan to cover all or

part of your course fee. We will ask you whether you would like to apply for a VET Student Loan when you enrol and advise you of the process.

To complete your VET Student Loan application, you will need to provide:

- Your Tax File Number (TFN). If you don't have a TFN, [click here](#) for information on how to apply for one. You can complete your loan application with a Certificate of Application for a TFN, but must provide your TFN as soon as it is issued. If you don't provide your TFN before your first census day, you will need to pay the tuition fees for that unit of study.
- Your Commonwealth Higher Education Student Support Number (CHESSN). If you have previously accessed a loan via the Higher Education Loan Program (HELP), either at TAFE or university, you will already have a CHESSN. You must use the same CHESSN whenever you access a student loan. If you don't have CHESSN, we will allocate one on your behalf.

To be eligible for a VET Student Loan, you will need to be assessed as academically suitable to undertake high level VET study. You will need to provide:

- A copy of your Australian Year 12 Certificate; OR
- A copy of a certificate showing that you have been awarded a qualification at level 4 or above in the Australian Qualifications Framework (where the language of instruction was English). If you previously completed a Certificate IV or higher qualification at TAFE NSW, just let us know where and when you studied in your application; OR
- Display competence at Exit Level 3 in the Australian Core Skills Framework in both reading and numeracy through an approved Language, Literacy and Numeracy test. We will let you know if this is required once you apply.
