The nationally recognised Certificate III in Roof Tiling is the industry accepted apprenticeship qualification for roof tilers. Learn the skills and knowledge you need to work on a range of domestic, commercial and industrial roof tiling projects, and be eligible to apply for your licence when you graduate.

INDUSTRY DEMAND

According to Job Outlook, the number of people working in roof tiling grew strongly over the past five years and growth is expected to remain strong over the next five. This growth is closely correlated with the building market, and the demand for upgrading and installing roofing in residential, commercial and industrial projects.

Entry Requirements

When you study with TAFE NSW, we want you to succeed. Entry requirements allow us to make sure that you have the right pre-existing knowledge and skills to achieve your chosen qualification. You will need to provide evidence that you meet the requirements listed in this section.

TAFE NSW offers the Certificate III in Roof Tiling as an apprenticeship program.

To be eligible for this course, you must:

- Be employed as an apprentice roof tiler evidenced by a letter of support from your employer
- Submit your training plan proposal (TPP) with your application
- Hold a valid general construction induction card (commonly known as a white card)

Evidence of the above entry requirements will be collected at the time of enrolment.

IS THIS COURSE RIGHT FOR YOU?

To be prepared for this course, it is recommended that you:

- Are comfortable working at heights and outdoors
- Have good work practices including a can-do attitude and punctuality
- Can collaborate in team environments
- Effective communication
- Can problem solve and find solutions

LICENSING REQUIREMENTS

This is a licensed occupation. NSW Fair Trading is the licensing and regulatory authority for trades and contractor authorities in NSW.

When you successfully complete the Certificate III in Roof Tiling you can apply for licensing with NSW Fair Trading. Further information can be found on their website.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

With 130 locations across the state, TAFE NSW tailors qualifications to meet the needs of the local community and specific student groups (like apprentices, fast-tracked and online students). To make sure this course is the right fit for you, we will need you to demonstrate that you can meet the additional requirements below.

To be enrolled in this course, you need to be able to provide evidence that you are:

- an apprentice (you will work in industry and study at the same time)
- employed full time
- signed up with an Apprentice Network Provider and have a Training Plan Proposal
- seeking to gain skills and knowledge to become a qualified roof tiler after successful completion
- have a registered apprenticeship contract with us
- a letter from us accepting your placement

To successfully complete this course, you are required to bring to class your own Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) safety goggles, earplugs, gloves, steel capped boots, suitable work clothing and a laptop computer or PC (Windows 10) computer tablet 8 inch (min) or tablet, paper and pens, calculator, compass, ruler, steel tape 5m or 8m and the textbook - Basic Building and Construction Skills 5E edition.

Work Placement is a requirement of this course. You need to be employed as a Roof Tiling apprentice so that you will be able to practice and develop your competency in the workplace.

SMART AND SKILLED FEES

There are a range of study options for NSW Apprentices and eligible non-apprentices with relevant industry work experience in this course.

Under the NSW Government fee-free apprenticeship initiative, NSW apprentices that commence their training on or after 1 July 2018 may be eligible for fee-free training. Apprentices are required to provide evidence of their NSW apprenticeship to finalise their enrolment and applicable fees.

This course is also a TAFE NSW Trade Pathways Qualification and ideal if you have been working in this industry for an extended period of time but havent received a qualification. To be eligible to enrol as a non-apprentice and secure funding, you must firstly meet the Smart and Skilled eligibility criteria and be:

- over 21 years of age
- able to demonstrate and provide evidence of extensive industry experience and
- able to demonstrate relevant ongoing work experience and provide workplace evidence to support

the achievement of competence.
