Course Description

This qualification reflects the role of individuals who design for live theatre performance. They execute judgements across a broad range of technical functions in the entertainment industry and have a wide range of specialised technical, creative or conceptual skills. They have autonomy in performing and can be responsible for planning, coordinating and evaluating the work of others within broad parameters.

National Code of Practice for Induction for Construction Work:

Sets and staging for some performances or events may fall within the definition of construction work. If so, people entering the construction site are required to complete the general induction training program specified by the National Code of Practice for Induction Training for Construction Work (Australian Safety Compensation Council, May 2007). Achievement of the unit 'CPCCOHS1001A Work safely in the construction industry' from the CPC08 Construction, Plumbing and Services Training Package fulfils this requirement.

Entry Requirements

When you study with TAFE NSW, we want you to succeed. Entry requirements allow us to make sure that you have the right pre-existing knowledge and skills to achieve your chosen qualification. You will need to provide evidence that you meet the requirements listed in this section.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To be selected for a place in this course, you will need to:

- Have completed the unit, CUS0HS301A or the equivalent updated unit CUAWHS302 - Follow occupational health and safety procedures, or can demonstrate equivalence
- Demonstrate your production design skills that support learning at Diploma level

To be eligible for this course, you will need to demonstrate the ability to:

- Engage with the design process by developing solutions through research, reflection and generating and refining ideas
- Produce a body of design work demonstrating the ability to respond effectively and creatively to design challenges and requirements
- Refine concepts in line with current industry standards

You will also need to demonstrate that you have knowledge of trends and traditions in at least one of the following areas:

- Costume
- Lighting
- Scenery and props
- Screen and media
- Sound
- Staging
- Vision systems

Your skills and knowledge may have been acquired through personal or work experience, or through formal study.

IS THIS COURSE RIGHT FOR YOU?

To be prepared for this course, it is recommended that you have:

- Creative thinking and problem solving skills
- Adept at design thinking
- The ability to seek constructive feedback on work
- The ability to collaborate and work as part of team

LICENSING REQUIREMENTS

There are many different employment outcomes in the live production industry and which career path you choose can impact on the licensing requirements you will need to achieve. Depending on the electives you study, you may have to complete additional units to be eligible to apply for a licence.

Construction white card

Sets and staging for some performances or events may fall within the definition of construction work. When it does, people entering the construction site are required to have a white card. This is specified by the National Code of Practice for Induction Training for Construction Work (ASCC 2007).

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

STUDY COMMITMENT

This is a full time blended course. You will need to attend approximately 18 hours of class, over 3 days a week, for 36 weeks/ 1 year. As well as the in-class component, you will need to complete approximately 16 hours of other study per week.

You may also be required to complete approximately 16 hours of additional study each week outside of class hours, including private study, assignment preparation and research.

This course is approved for a Commonwealth VET Student Loan (VSL). If you meet the VSL eligibility and academic suitability requirements, you are able to apply to the Commonwealth for a loan to cover all or part of your course fee. We will ask you whether you would like to apply for a VET Student Loan when you enrol and advise you of the process.

Direct payment by Unit of Study instalments is available for this course.

The Units of Study and associated fees for this course are detailed below. Fees are charged on the census day for each Unit of Study. To secure a loan for part or all of your course, you must be eligible and submit a valid application to the Commonwealth for a VET Student Loan. You may withdraw prior to the census date without incurring a fee.

ADDITIONAL RESOURCES

You will need to provide for yourself the following resources which you will keep when you complete your study:

Additional resources will be required to successfully complete this course and will cost approximately \$190.00 for materials/consumables, subsidising field trips and visits, safety equipment and/or toolkits and general resources.

To complete your VET Student Loan application, you will need to provide:

- Your Tax File Number (TFN). If you don't have a TFN, [click here](#) for information on how to apply for one. You can complete your loan application with a Certificate of Application for a TFN, but must provide your TFN as soon as it is issued. If you don't provide your TFN before your first census day, you will need to pay the tuition fees for that unit of study.
- Your Commonwealth Higher Education Student Support Number (CHESSN). If you have previously accessed a loan via the Higher Education Loan Program (HELP), either at TAFE or university, you will already have a CHESSN. You must use the same CHESSN whenever you access a student loan. If you don't have CHESSN, we will allocate one on your behalf.

To be eligible for a VET Student Loan, you will need to be assessed as academically suitable to undertake high level VET study. You will need to provide:

- A copy of your Australian Year 12 Certificate; OR
- A copy of a certificate showing that you have been awarded a qualification at level 4 or above in the Australian Qualifications Framework (where the language of instruction was English). If you previously completed a Certificate IV or higher qualification at TAFE NSW, just let us know where and when you studied in your application; OR
- Display competence at Exit Level 3 in the Australian Core Skills Framework in both reading and numeracy through an approved Language, Literacy and Numeracy test. We will let you know if this is required once you apply.
