Course Description

This course provides the skills and knowledge to work as an enrolled nurse under the supervision of the registered nurse in a variety of settings including acute, aged care, community, rehabilitation and mental health. It will provide the theoretical and practical skills to:

- relate the concepts of the person, environment and health to the safe and effective practice of nursing
- participate in a multidisciplinary team to assist the individual to meet their needs
- practise in a safe and culturally competent manner to meet the physical, psychosocial, emotional and mental health needs of individuals
- practice within the nursing professional standards, codes of practice and state legislation
- develop, monitor and maintain a holistic plan of care in collaboration with the RN, multidisciplinary team
- demonstrate effective communication and documentation skills in a variety of healthcare settings
- participate in professional development of self
- practise within safety standards and quality improvement guidelines
- engage in reflective practice, nursing research and critically analyse and apply evidence based practice to nursing care

To complete the Diploma of Nursing students are required to successfully complete all units and complete a minimum of 400hrs of unpaid professional experience to meet the assessment requirements of the units. On completion of HLT54115 qualification students are eligible to apply for registration as an Enrolled Nurse with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (<http://www.ahpra.gov.au>).
ENROLLING IN FIRST AID UNITS OF COMPETENCY If you are enrolling in a First Aid unit of competency you are advised that to complete the unit you must be able to perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR)

for at least 2 minutes on the floor. If you have a disability that would prevent you from performing required basic life support skills you are advised that you will not be able to achieve the unit of competency.

Entry Requirements

When you study with TAFE NSW, we want you to succeed. Entry requirements allow us to make sure that you have the right pre-existing knowledge and skills to achieve your chosen qualification. You will need to provide evidence that you meet the requirements listed in this section

Year 12 or equivalent Or Certificate III

PLUS English language requirements for course entry You must demonstrate your English language competency in one of the following ways:

1. If English is your primary language and you have attended and satisfactorily completed at least six years of primary and secondary education taught and assessed in English in one of the recognised countries, including at least two years between years 7 and 12. (Recognised countries are Australia, Canada, New Zealand, Republic of Ireland, South Africa, United Kingdom, and USA)

OR

2. Completion of five years (full-time equivalent) continuous education taught and assessed solely in English, which includes a combination of secondary, tertiary, or secondary vocational education qualifications, or a combination of all three in one of the recognised countries above no more than five years prior to applying for registration

NOTE: the English language requirements includes that your Diploma of Nursing must be a minimum of one year full time equivalent pre-registration program of study otherwise English language testing is an additional requirement. Or 3. English Language achievement in AHPRA approved tests including: (Please note that the results can be collected across two tests within a six month period)

- Academic International English Language Testing System (IELTS) examination with a minimum score overall score of 7.0 and a minimum score of 7.0 in each of the 4 components - listening, reading, writing and speaking from one test sitting.
- Occupational English Test (OET) with minimum score of B in each of the 4 components
- PTE Academic with a minimum overall score of 65 and a minimum score of 65 in each of the 4 components in one sitting
- TOEFL iBT at a minimum overall score of 94 with reading at a minimum of 24, listening a minimum of 24, speaking at a minimum of 23 and writing at a minimum of 27
- Other English language tests approved by the Board from time to time

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

With 130 locations across the state, TAFE NSW tailors qualifications to meet the needs of the local community and specific student groups (like apprentices, fast-tracked and online students). To make sure this course is the right fit for you, we may need you to demonstrate that you can meet any additional requirements. Professional experience With supervised professional experience, you will reinforce the theory and skills learned in class while gaining real-world experience in a healthcare environment. Prior to undertaking professional experience you must be prepared to:

1. NSW HEALTH Before you commence any professional experience in NSW Health facilities, you will be required to
 - Meet NSW Health's - Criminal Record Check requirements;
 - Sign the NSW Health Code of Conduct form and any other forms, as required by NSW Health;

- Undertake Occupational Assessment, Screening and Vaccination against Infectious Diseases and provide your Health Care Worker/Student Vaccination Record Card. - 3. COMMUNITY AND CHILDREN'S SERVICES Anyone in child-related work (including student professional experience and volunteers) MUST have a current Working with Children Check (students/volunteers free) in line with the Office of Children's Guardian phase-in schedule and processes. - 4. STUDENT READINESS FOR PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE Professional experience will only occur after there has been a reasonable amount of student/teacher contact and when the teacher is satisfied that you are ready to benefit from workplace learning and perform workplace duties. STUDY COMMITMENT This course is run over 18 months, with 21 hours per week face to face in a block release format: -Block I - 10 weeks -Block II - 7 weeks -Block III - 6 weeks -Block IV - 4 weeks There is also 11 weeks (440 hours) of work placement in between blocks dependant on when the positions are available in NSW Clinconnect. As well as the in-class and work placement components, you should expect to do additional study over the duration of the course including online learning, research, independent study and assessment preparation with access to a computer with headsets, and the ability to record video and audio. The amount of self study will vary depending on your work placement schedule but average about 10 hours per week.

WORK PLACEMENT A different work placement will follow each block of learning in various health facilities where TAFE NSW has a student placement agreement and the facility has been deemed suitable for placement.

Students will have a comprehensive training record book which contains all skills, observations reflections required for each unit of competence to be completed in the workplace.

Before commencement of professional experience in NSW Health facilities, students will be required to:

- Meet NSW Health's criminal record check requirements;
- Sign the NSW Health code of conduct form and any other forms, as required by NSW health;
- Undertake occupational assessment, screening and vaccination against infectious diseases and provide your health care worker/student vaccination record card.
- Complete mandatory online modules as required by facilities NOTE: Student must be 18 years of age as of the end of the first clinical block. Students are required to cover the travel and accommodation costs associated with work placement

Enrolled nurses are accountable for their own practice and remain responsible to a registered nurse for the delegated care. This offering is designed for new entrants to the profession.
