Evidence required

- A Confirmation of Aboriginality letter (see note below) or alternative form of evidence of Aboriginality or
- A letter of approval from a local Aboriginal community organisation where you plan to study

Note: In NSW, a Confirmation of Aboriginality letter can be issued by any NSW-incorporated Aboriginal organisation or Local Aboriginal Land Council. Refer to the Department of Aboriginal Affairs for further details.
