ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for this course, you must:

- Identify as an Aboriginal person, and have a Confirmation of Aboriginality letter OR
- Have the approval of the local Aboriginal community if you are a non-Aboriginal person, as evidenced by a letter of approval from the local Aboriginal community where you plan to study
- You will also need to participate in a phone interview with one of our teaching staff to make sure this is the appropriate course level for you

Note: In NSW, a Confirmation of Aboriginality letter can be issued by any NSW-incorporated Aboriginal organisation or Local Aboriginal Land Council. Refer to the Department of Aboriginal Affairs for further details.

Traineeship

TAFE NSW also offers the Certificate IV in Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Primary Health Care Practice as a traineeship. To be eligible to enrol as a trainee you must:

- Be employed in the health industry as this course is delivered in the workplace
- Have a signed traineeship contract

COURSE SUCCESS REQUIREMENTS
