COURSE SUCCESS REQUIREMENTS

During your study, you need to meet specific requirements that are necessary for you to complete your course work.

You need to meet the following success requirements to be able to undertake work placement within industry. Your teacher will let you know when you need to provide evidence of:

- A valid Working with Children Check (WWCC)
- Evidence of an up-to-date vaccination history

Work placement with NSW Health

If your work placement is with NSW Health you must also:

- Sign the NSW Health Code of Conduct and any other forms
- Complete mandatory online modules
- Take an occupational assessment and provide your health care worker/student vaccination record
